

Report on
Hong Kong's Role in Combating Climate Change

In the Hong Kong's Climate Change Strategy and Action Agenda – Consultation Document 2010, the proposed carbon intensity reduction target is 50-60% reduction by 2020 compared with the 2005 level. To address this issue, the Energy Institute (Hong Kong Branch) and the City University of Hong Kong jointly organized a *Seminar on Hong Kong's Role in Combating Climate Change* on 10th December 2010 for members, colleagues, students and guests.

There were more than 50 participants. The Speaker, Mr. Chong Chan-yau (Board Chairman, Carbon Care Asia; Honorary Advisor, Centre for Development and Resources for Students at The University of Hong Kong; Chairman, “Dialogue in the Dark” Foundation Charity and Chairman, Hong Kong People's Council on Sustainable Development) discussed how we could achieve this aggressive target in Hong Kong.
